<sup>17</sup> 'You shall tell Joseph, "Now please forgive the disobedience of your brothers, and their sin, because they did evil to you." Now, please forgive the disobedience of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him.

<sup>18</sup> His brothers also went and fell down before his face; and they said,"Behold, we are your servants."

<sup>19</sup> Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid, for am I in the place of God?

<sup>20</sup> As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring to pass, as it is this day, to save many people alive.

## Romans 8 (WEB)

<sup>28</sup> We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, to those who are called according to his purpose.

<sup>29</sup> For whom he foreknew, he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers.

<sup>30</sup> Whom he predestined, those he also called. Whom he called, those he also justified. Whom he justified, those he also glorified.

**31** What then shall we say about these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?

Both of the passages referenced just below the hymn's title show that God does in fact work in our lives to transform this world into a better one. God
